### Rapid On-Site Testing Available

We are now able to provide Covid-19 Rapid tests to guest groups and summer campers at registration. This will help reduce anxiety about spending time at camp in community with others. The rapid test is nasal swab taken from the lower nose. The individual being tested can swab their own nose. Rapid tests take 15 minutes for results. We hope that testing will no longer be need but we wanted to be prepared in case Covid continued to be a factor next summer!
